The first is, the Saukville Fire Department combined operations with the Grafton Fire Department in January to form the Ozaukee Central Fire Department (OCFD). The new department was formed to provide more efficient services to our communities and to reduce response times and ensure 24/7 Firefighting and Paramedic coverage. The OCFD is a consolidated and jointly funded Fire Department among four communities: Village of Grafton, Village of Saukville, Town of Grafton and the Town of Saukville. I reflect back on how this came together in 18 months and it is because of the great group that came together to make this happen.

The second development is the mixed use Planned Unit Development know as Northern Gateway Community Collective taking shape just north of Piggly Wiggly. Specifically the Gateway Sports Academy which is under construction and expected to open this May. I was given the opportunity in late February to walk through the sports complex and it is an impressive facility . I look forward to the opportunities this venue will provide. This truly is a one of a kind asset to our community.

RUMMAGE & REAL ESTATE SALE SIGNS

Village Ordinance regarding rummage/garage sale, real estate, directional, or informational signs states that such signs must comply with traffic visibility requirements and are not permitted in Village parks or median areas. Improperly placed signs will be confiscated. Signs shall be erected no more than 24 hours before a rummage sale and taken down no later than 24 hours after. Before starting any construction project, contact the Village's Permit and Inspection Dept. at (262)375-5305 or visit the online Permit Portal link on the Village website. Most home construction/remodel projects will require a permit (building, electrical, plumbing) before work can begin.



2ND INSTALLMENT PROPERTY TAX PAYMENTS

All 2024 property taxes not paid by January 31, 2025 must be paid to the Ozaukee County Treasurer. Second installment payments are due to the County Treasurer **by July 31, 2025**. Make checks payable to and mail to the Ozaukee County Treasurer or pay at Port Washington State Bank, Saukville Branch, after July 1st.



Village Hall can not accept or process these payments.

TORNADO/SEVERE WEATHER AWARENESS WEEK - APRIL 7-11

According to the National Weather Service, Wisconsin averages 23 tornadoes annually, with most occurring in the 3 - 9 p.m. time frame. The peak tornado season is May through August, with June having the greatest number of tornadoes.

A Statewide Tornado Drill is planned for Thursday, April 10th.

A mock tornado watch will be issued statewide by the National Weather Service at 1:00 p.m. followed by two statewide tornado warnings at 1:45 and 6:45 p.m. If there is a threat of severe weather in Wisconsin on April 10th, the drill will be postponed until April 11th. The drill will go on in all other conditions including non-severe weather (clouds, rain, dark sky, scattered thunderstorms, etc.). If severe weather is also expected on April 11th, the drill will be cancelled. Please reserve this time to practice your own tornado and severe weather safety plans.

SPRING FLOODING

As the snow and ice melt and spring rains drench our area, rivers, creeks, and wetlands may rise and overflow their banks flooding roads and recreation areas. Flood waters can carry hidden and dangerous debris beneath the surface, as well as be contaminated with road grime. Wading into or driving through flooded areas is extremely dangerous. Just a little running water can sweep a person or a full sized vehicle away. The road beneath any water, running or still, could be damaged or gone. Motor vehicles stalled in flood waters leave occupants trapped in a very hazardous situation. Swift water rescues are extremely dangerous for both the citizens and the first responders.

Please avoid flooded areas... **TURN AROUND - DON'T DROWN.**



YARD WASTE (COMPOST) DISPOSAL

How do you dispose of garden waste, leaves, and lawn rakings from your spring/summer yard clean-up? Wisconsin DNR strongly recommends that these materials NOT be placed in the street at any time.

DPW does NOT collect spring clean-up yard debris street side. You must containerize debris and bring to the compost drop-off site during open hours.

Please help prevent plugged storm sewers by making sure catch basins near your property are clear of debris.

CURBSIDE CHIPPING

The Village chipper will tour the Village on **Mondays, March 31st through November 10th** (excluding holiday weeks).

Please observe the curbside requirements on the DPW Services page (next). Please also note:

- DO NOT place branches curbside sooner than the immediately preceding weekend. We DO NOT chip tree stumps.
- The chipping crew is limited to 20 minutes per address, after which a \$50.00 fee is charged for each additional 20 minutes at the property owner's request.
- Weekly curb chipping will NOT be chipping tree removals.
- BRANCHES ARE NOT accepted at the Compost Site.
- **The property owner/occupant is responsible for removal/disposal of limbs larger than 3" diameter, and for full tree removal including cut branches resulting from tree removal process.**
- **Residents can pick up chippings at the DPW site or have a minimum truck load delivered.**

Call the DPW office (262)284-0545 to make arrangement.

DEFECTIVE SIDEWALKS

If you know of any sidewalk section in need of repair, please report it to Village Hall or the DPW office. The Village allocates funds each year to address the priority problems which mostly involve tripping hazards greater than a 3/4" offset. Damage due to street trees is not charged to the homeowner. Most tripping edges are saw cut by a contract service. Sunken sections at a house utility trench are a lower priority and are the homeowners financial responsibility to make repairs. Contact the DPW for more information.

MAILBOX POSTS - REPAIR OR REPLACE BEFORE WINTER

If you have a weak or rotting mail box post, this is the time to change it so it is stable for winter. In most cases, a strong post and secure mailbox will withstand the impact of snow coming from a snowplow. Most plow damage occurs when the mailbox projects too far into the street or the post is weak or rotten. Keeping the mailbox projection at least 2 inches behind the back of the concrete curb is recommended. Wood and metal pipe are the only allowable post materials. Brick or concrete posts are **not** allowed for motorists safety reasons.

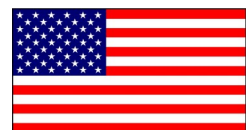

How to Display the American Flag

Here are few basic guidelines to keep in mind based on the U.S. Flag Code:



- Always make sure the flag never touches the ground or anything below it.
- Do not display the American flag in inclement weather, unless it's an all-weather flag.
- If you want to fly the flag after sunset, keep it well lit.
- When displayed either horizontally or vertically against a wall, the Union (blue section) should be uppermost and to the flag's own right, that is, to the observer's left. When displayed in a window, the flag should be displayed in the same way, with the Union to the left of the observer's view.
- No other flag or pennant should be placed above, or, if on the same level, to the right of the American flag.

Wondering what you should do when your flag becomes worn and no longer suited for public display? The U.S. flag code requires it to be disposed of respectfully, preferably by burning. Many local VFW posts and American Legions hold ceremonies to retire flags. Saukville Legion Post 470 has a drop box outside the Legion hall to drop your flags for proper disposal. Contact them at (262)284-2787 with questions.

2025 BRANCH CHIPPING

The Wood Chipper will tour the Village to Chip Brush/Branches ONLY.
MONDAYS – March 31st thru November 10th (No Chipping During Holiday Weeks)

- Branches must be curbside by 6:30 a.m. Monday mornings; 3" max. diameter - cut ends facing street.
- No Stumps/No Compost; 20-minute time limit per address applies.
- Per Village Ordinance 187-21, · The property owner/occupant is responsible for removal/disposal of limbs larger than 3" diameter, and for the full tree removal including cut branches resulting from a tree removal process. Tree removal debris will NOT be chipped by Village chipper.

Due to the curbside branch chipping collection service, the Village DPW has a surplus of woodchips.

- Residents can pick up woodchips at the DPW yard waste site at 649 S. Main St. during compost site open hours.
- Bring your own containers and pitch fork/shovel – tools and containers are not provided.
- The DPW will deliver only full truck loads (3-5 yards) of chips to residential addresses within the Village upon request. We do not come back to pick up any unused woodchips. Call the DPW at 284-0545 to arrange delivery.

How Do I Dispose of...???

How often have you cleaned out the basement or garage and found yourself looking at items you didn't know what to do with - old appliances and furniture, TVs, tires, auto batteries, waste oil - to name a few? Local waste haulers will not accept many of these items. Don't despair; there are still means available to dispose of this stuff, although a small fee may be required.



White Goods - Drop-off site located at the Village of Saukville DPW, 649 S. Main Street. Available Saturdays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, & Thursdays during regular Compost Site schedule. Village residents only. Drop off unwanted white goods - air conditioners, dehumidifiers, dishwashers, washers/dryers, microwaves, ovens/ranges/stoves, refrigerators, freezers, & water heaters. No home pick-up is available.

Furniture, bedding, household items - if clean and in good shape, resale stores - St. Vincent de Paul or Goodwill - may accept the items. If not hazardous materials/electronic and fits, these items can go in your trash cart. Or, arrange for a special pickup with Waste Management (262-251-4000) There will be a fee for special pick-up.

⇒ **The Village of Saukville provides a clean-up dumpster each spring** - two Saturdays in mid-to-late April for furniture and household items (no electronics or hazardous items). Village residents only. Limitations apply.

Rechargeable tool and cell phone batteries (Ni-Cad, Nickel Metal Hydride) . Saukville Police Dept. accepts many of these batteries. Call (262)284-0444 for info.

Recycling, Electronics, Scrap Metals - Ozaukee Iron & Metal, LLC - 728 Schmitz Drive, Port Washington. Accepts furniture, mattresses, carpet, Freon units, some appliances and electronics, household batteries, tires, and more. Fees may apply. Buys certain electronic scrap and scrap metals. Call (262)284-4060 for complete list and fee info.

Household Hazardous Waste & Electronics – kitchen and bathroom, garage and workshop, home and garden products, some electronics – can be taken to the Ozaukee Co. Hazardous Waste Collection Site (Veolia ES Technical Solutions LLC) at 1275 Mineral Springs Drive., Port Washington. This site is open on Mondays only. Call (262)243-8998 for more information.

Waste Oil - County Highway Dept. drop-off site at 410 Spring Street, Port Washington (284-8331). Some of the local automotive service centers will also take it. OIL CANNOT BE CONTAMINATED WITH ANTI-FREEZE, SOLVENTS, OR OTHER VOLATILE FLUIDS.

Untreated, clean lumber - cut up and place in cart or burn in fire place or wood stove. Remove nails or hardware.

Treated lumber, railroad ties, and lumber containing creosote - call the Village contracted waste hauler to arrange for dumpster or pickup. Fees apply.

Tires - local automotive service centers. Most will charge a nominal fee.

Clothing & Other Apparel - local churches or charities may accept donations, or St. Vincent de Paul or Goodwill stores.

Remember... Dumping oil, anti-freeze, solvents, cleaners, paint, fuel, and other solids or liquids in storm sewers is ILLEGAL and can lead to substantial fines and jail time.

TRASH-RECYCLING SERVICES PROVIDED BY WASTE MANAGEMENT

Curbside collection day for the Village of Saukville is **Thursday** (Friday on weeks when a major holiday falls between Monday-Thursday and all municipal facilities are also closed). The following rules apply:



- Roll-out carts must be used. Any trash or recyclables placed curbside in any container other than the carts will not be collected.
- Carts must be placed curbside **by 7:00 a.m.** on pick-up day.
- Carts must face the street as indicated by the arrow, be fully accessible, and be placed side by side with a minimum of three feet of space between carts and/or obstacles.
- Recycle Collection - alternate Thursdays - collection dates can be found on the Village website, hard copy calendars at Village Hall.
- All recyclables can be placed in the same recycle cart.
- Carts are the property of Waste Management and must remain at the property should you move.
- Electronic devices, such as computers, monitors, printers, TVs, Fax machines, photocopiers, VCR & DVD players, cannot be disposed of in your household trash cart.
- Large Item Pick-up Service: There is a fee for large item pick-up requests. Contact Waste Management directly @ (262)251-4000 or wmeservice@wm.com for prices and information.
- **For Repair or Replacement of damaged carts or collection issues, contact Waste Management at (888)960-0008**

FIRE HYDRANT FLUSHING - 2025

The Water Department will be flushing hydrants throughout the Village Monday -Thursday, **April 28th – May 1st & May 5th – 8th** between 8:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. Any discoloration in your water is iron and is not harmful. Running your faucets for a short period of time after flushing in your area is completed will clear the lines. We recommend that you do not do laundry during flushing. If you do, and your clothes have a reddish appearance, **DO NOT DRY**; rather rewash in cold water to remove the discoloration. You may want to bottle some water for drinking, cooking, etc. prior to the flushing event.



WATER METER CHANGE OUT PROGRAM

Throughout the next 6 years, the Village of Saukville Water Department will be replacing all residential water meters and testing commercial/business meters. Periodic changeout of water meters is a PSC requirement. It is the property owner's responsibility to:



1. Provide a clear path to the water meter.
2. Provide fully operable shut off valves on both sides of the meter. If these valves leak or fail during the meter replacement, it is the property owner's responsibility to replace or repair them.

WATER VALVES

Exercise your valves above and below the water meter at least quarterly. Knowing where your valves are and that they are working properly is critical so that you can easily turn the water off in the event of a water emergency and prevent potential extensive property damage to your home/basement. It is the property owners responsibility to make sure valves function properly if the water utility comes to change out a home/business water meter.

CROSS CONNECTION CONTROL PROGRAM

The Village's Cross Connection Control Inspection Program, managed by HydroCorp Inc. (HCI), is continuing in 2025. A cross connection is a direct or potential connection between any part of the public water supply system and a source of contamination or pollution, i.e.: garden hose, dish washer, toilets, pools, lawn sprinklers. This inspection action is necessary in order to reduce overall costs for compliance with DNR Regulation NR810.15. HydroCorp will be contacting homeowners and businesses to arrange for an inspection. There is no cost for the inspection. Each inspection takes less than 20 minutes on average for a home and 45 minutes for a business.

SUMP Pumps

Remember to check your sump pump and make sure it is hooked up correctly to the discharge lateral and not to the sanitary sewer system. Per Village Ordinance, it is illegal to hook-up or discharge storm or clear water into the Village's sanitary sewer lines. Since all discharges to the sanitary sewer end up at the treatment plant, this creates additional problems to properly process the wastewater for eventual discharge to the river.

UTILITY BILLING PAYMENT OPTIONS

The Village has a number of payment options available:



- Mail-in, walk-in, or outside drop box payments
- Pay at Port Washington State Bank, Saukville branch
- Phone payment option thru payment center (see website) - service fee applies.
- Online payment through a secure link on the Village website - service fees apply.
- Automatic deduction from a selected bank account. No service fees for this option; no more late fees.

IT'S A TOILET, NOT A TRASHCAN—WHAT NOT TO FLUSH

There are only two things that can be safely flushed down the toilet - human waste and toilet paper. Any other item has the potential to clog up the system, regardless of how easily it appears to flush. Unfortunately, many of the items that often end up in the toilet can cause significant clogging problems, not only in your home's plumbing but also for the Village's sewer system and Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) processes. Common items that are often flushed that **SHOULD NOT BE** are:

- Wipes (baby wipes, disinfecting wipes, flushable wipes)
- Facial Tissue
- Feminine Hygiene Products
- Cotton Swabs
- Dental Floss
- Grease



Often these items do not even make it past the lateral connection from your home to the sewer system, building up and clogging the line. If these products make it to the street, they can still plug up and damage the pipes and pumps that convey sewage to the WWTP, potentially causing overflows and basement backups that can be costly to repair. If those products make it to the WWTP, they can also jam up equipment there.

NOTE: Pharmaceuticals and prescription drugs also should never be flushed down the toilet or thrown in the garbage. When put down the drain, pharmaceuticals can seep back into the drinking water supply. Treatment facilities are not designed to remove these contaminants. Local (Saukville P.D.) and County drop-off sites are available to safely dispose of unused/unwanted pharmaceuticals

WATER BILLS AND WATER LEAKS IN HOMES

Your water bills are determined when the Water Utility staff reads your water meter. When your water bill becomes higher than normal, there is usually a leak in your home. 95% of all leaks are toilets and most times you cannot hear the leak. The toilet most likely to leak is the one rarely used. We recommend that you check your toilets every 6 months to make sure they are not leaking. Place a drop of natural food coloring in the tank - do not flush. Check it in 15-20 minutes. If color appears in the bowl, it is leaking water. You can also pick up a complimentary test kit at Village Hall. Also, by reading your meter weekly you can monitor usage and find any leaking much sooner.

MED-RETURN COLLECTION UNIT

Please do not discard old medications by flushing them down the toilet or throwing them in the trash. Save them in a safe place and bring them to the Saukville Police Department in a sealed Ziploc bag for proper disposal, (pill bottles not needed) Monday through Friday during normal business hours. Call the Police Dept. for guidelines and info on what is accepted for drop-off.

CURFEW ORDINANCE

The Village of Saukville has an 11:00 p.m. curfew for minors under the age of 16 years. Parents will be held accountable for any vandalism that their children do to Village property. Please know where your children are and urge them to obey the Curfew Law.

HUNTER SAFETY

The Saukville Police Department offers Hunter Safety twice a year; Spring and Fall. (March & September) Dates are released a month before sign-up and posted on the PD's Facebook Page. Hunter Safety is for anyone 10 years of age or older. Sign-up is **IN PERSON** only at the Saukville Police Department during normal business hours (M – F 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m.) Cost is \$10/person (cash or check only) DNR Customer ID # is required at sign-up. If you do not have a DNR Customer ID #, you can obtain one by contacting the DNR (888)936-7463. Any questions, contact the Police Department.

Community FAQs

Can I burn in the Village of Saukville?

Recreational burning is allowed under certain conditions. Portable outdoor fire stoves/pits and in-ground pits are allowed but must include a cover and cannot exceed 36 inches in diameter. In-ground pits without covers are not permitted. All recreational fires must comply with the requirements of NFPA 1. Refer to the Village of Saukville Municipal Code or contact the fire department for more information. **The burning of yard waste is prohibited in the village.**

Can I launch fireworks?

No. Fireworks and other pyrotechnics are strictly prohibited. Fireworks may only be used by public authorities, fair associations, amusement parks, park boards, civic organizations and groups of individuals that have been granted permits for such displays by the Village President.
